Brent and his wife, Amanda, are the directors of the multi-time ACHF National Champion Rhythm-N-Motion Cloggers (rNm) from Cookeville, Tennessee. rNm performs both contemporary and traditional clogging and has been together for over 25 years.

rNm has performed numerous times on the Grand Ole Opry. They have also performed in Ottawa, Canada for the Ottawa Senators NHL Team; in Washington D.C. in the 4th of July Independence Day Celebration at the Lincoln Memorial and Independence Day Parade; opened for country acts Dan Seals and Exile; and are regular cast members of the Renfro Valley Barn Dance in Kentucky. They have performed for many charities over the years including the Vanderbilt Children's Hospital, Open Arms Caregivers Organization, United Way, CRMC Cancer Center, Ottawa Children's Foundation, Relay for Life, and more.

Amanda has been dancing over 25 years and was inducted onto the 2000 All-American Clogging Team, 2010 Team of the Decade, and won the Melvin Sloan Opry award, allowing her to perform with the Grand Ole Opry Dancers. Amanda is a certified judge and serves on ACHF committees.

Amanda works at Walt Disney World in Orlando, FL at the Magic Kingdom. She has had the enjoyment of working in every Disney Park and in most of Disney's resort hotels. She also works special celebrity events and conventions as well as the Atlanta Braves spring training games at the ESPN Sportsplex in WDW.

Brent has been dancing over 33 years and was inducted onto the 1994 All-American Clogging Team, 1997 International Team, and 2000 Team of the Millennium. Brent was a member of the Melvin Sloan Dancers and performed every Saturday night on the Grand Ole Opry for 10 years.

He has also performed in Peru, South America with an international folk festival; in Walt Disney World, Universal Studios, Carnival Cruise Lines, the Kentucky Derby, Dollywood, and Silver Dollar City in Branson. Brent is a certified judge and Rep and serves on ACHF committees.

Brent was Valedictorian of his 403-student high school class and holds a Degree in Accounting. He has worked as a Financial Analyst in his careers at TVA (Tennessee Valley Authority), Cummins Engine, and currently at Crossville Tile.

Together, Brent & Amanda have taught hundreds and hundreds of children, teens, and adults not only how to dance, but how to have fun and how to interact and be in front of an audience of any type. Together they have helped keep alive the tradition of this dance.
